Impact on learning:

Havering Sports Collective

Through being part of the Sports Collective, our pupils have been able to take part in a range of sporting events held at different schools and venues in the borough. This has included multi-sports, netball, quick fire cricket, football and Tennis. Once again, we have been successful in many of these competitions and many pupils had the opportunity to be a part of a variety of events; from both key stage 1 and 2. This has enabled them to meet children from other schools, and develop their physical skills alongside their life skills i.e. teamwork and communication.

The collective also provided us with sports crew training, where a group of year 5 children took part in a workshop and learnt how to set up many different fun activities. They then applied this learning to a Year One class and the enjoyment was evident. The sports crew will also be helping with our whole school interhouse competition during sports week which the collective is running for us. In doing this, every child in the school has the opportunity to get involved in competition this year, giving them a strong sense of belonging where every child is important and involved. We recognise the high importance of inclusion in PE, as we do in all areas of the curriculum. The collective has also organised virtual competitions, for example skipping week and dance week. St Joseph's of course got involved and the children enjoyed practicing a new skill they might not have tried before. It also allowed those children who do not enjoy physical activity as much as others to get involved in a sporting competition, as research projects were given to children to complete at home and submit as



entries. St Joseph's children tried hard with this and we were able to submit some fantastic research.

The collective is also supporting us in other aspects of the curriculum at St Joseph's. They are providing us with an assembly during out 'Queen's Jubilee celebrations' in an attempt to teach the children about the common wealth and the common wealth games. The children will be doing activities surrounding this topic in their English and History lessons in class, so is an excellent way for them to make connections in their learning.

Swimming and transport

Years 4 and 5 have been lucky enough to have the opportunity to swim all year again this year. The impact of this has been clear, as 95% of pupils in Year 6 can now swim and 88% of pupils in Year 5.

PE equipment

New resources were purchased in order to improve the quality of the sessions for those children who take part in school clubs. New kits were also purchased for some school teams, helping the children to feel proud of representing their school. Some of the money for these kits was kindly donated by our parents' association.

We have also purchased resources in order for children to be taught orienteering in school. We feel that this will have great benefit for our pupils in the long term as it is an activity which appeals to those children who are not necessarily the sportiest, as it involves lots of problem solving and other life skills.

Keeping pupils happy, safe and occupied at break and lunchtimes is vital and some of the new additions to our equipment have certainly helped that. Our Year 6 play leaders now have quality equipment in order to enhance the experience that our younger pupils have at lunchtimes.
