
- All homework will be put on Google classroom, where possible please return homework via Google classroom

- Long hair, including boys, to be tied back




Reading

Google Classroom and Maths


Each term, we will post a workbook onto Google Classroom for each topic that we cover in Maths. These are entirely optional and for you to use at home if you want to.

- ✓ Reading- A range of texts
 - ✓ Children should be reading regularly and a good amount each time (roughly 10 minutes a day).
 - √ 3 comments weekly, written by the children, and recorded in reading record book
 - ✓ Parent signed
- ✓ Comprehension
- ✓ Times Tables Rockstars 3-5 minutes per day
- ✓ Maths- My Maths
- ✓ Spellings- weekly spellings
- ✓ All homework will be put on Google classroom and can be submitted on there also.
 - *Please note spelling homework sheets do not have to be returned or submitted on GC.
