


School Uniform





School uniform is a good way of helping children to feel part of the school community. It is also a practical way of dressing your child for school and we seek the co-operation of all parents in maintaining the **exact** uniform both during the summer and winter.

RECEPTION YEAR UNIFORM
St Joseph's Infant P.E. Sweatshirt and Infant P.E. Jogging Bottoms
Loose fitting black sports shorts – no skin-tight or cycle shorts
Polo shirt in House colour with logo* (Parents are advised which colour to purchase)
White sports socks (not trainer liners)
Plain VELCRO black or white trainers with minimal colours and logos, and NO flashing lights
Infant Schoolbag: Folder style book bag **
Infant children also need an apron for painting. These should cover their arms as well.

Junior Schoolbags: Bags must be plain in colour and appropriate size for school.

Pupils are not allowed to bring designer type bags to school.

Hair

To comply with Health and Safety regulations all hair that can be tied back should be (regardless of gender). Functional and simple hair clips or bands are acceptable. They should be plain in design.

No fashion hairstyles e.g. shaved sides, lines and designs. No noticeable hair products e.g. gel, wax, colouring.

Jewellery

The wearing of jewellery is **not** permitted in school, with the exception of stud earrings for children in Year 1 or above, which must be plain gold, silver or plastic with no stones and no larger than 4mm. Only one stud per ear is allowed. Earrings must be removed on PE/Sport event days and so if you intend to have your child's ears pierced, this **must be done at the start of the longer summer break** to ensure that they have healed before returning to school. Reception children must not wear earrings at all.

Children should not wear any form of neck chain, bracelet or rings.

Children from Year 2 may wear an **analogue** watch when they are ready to tell the time. **Fitbits and SMART watches are not permitted**.

Please ensure that all items of school wear and equipment are marked with your child's name. So many articles and items look the same and it is impossible to identify owners without a clear name tag or label.

Lost Property

We have designated prefects who regularly look through lost property and return any named items to their rightful owner. It is for the children themselves to ensure that any clothing discarded in the playground is collected at the end of playtimes. Each term we have lost property on display for parents to have a look through. Items not collected at the end of the school year will be disposed of.

Water bottles

Children are encouraged to bring in a sensible water bottle on a daily basis, clearly labelled with their name, for use in class. Water bottles should have a sports cap (maximum height 22cm tall). Do not send in bottles with a screw cap, especially old Prime bottles.

It is best to avoid expensive/fashionable bottles (e.g. AirUp) as these often leak or can get damaged when dropped. Younger children often struggle to open them, depending on the design. The school will not be responsible for any bottles damaged during the day.
