




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Catholic Social Teaching

Year 1 Signing the Creed



Christmas Cards



Digging Into the Past: Year 3's Stone Age Discovery!

In Year 3, the children explored what Stone Age people ate by studying coprolites—fossilized human or animal poo! By carefully examining these ancient remains, the children found tiny clues, such as seeds, meat, and grains, that revealed the diets of people from long ago. Since the Stone Age was a time of pre-history, the children used this evidence to predict where these people might have lived and what their roles could have been within their communities. This hands—on investigation brought history to life and sparked their curiosity about the past!
