


## **NEWSLETTER**

#### **REMINDERS**

- ♦ Supervise Younger Children Please keep a close eye on younger siblings after school. They should not play on the equipment or ride scooters until they are outside the school gates.



#### CAFOD'S Jubilee Icon

We were incredibly fortunate to have the Jubilee Icon visit our school as part of its tour around England and Wales. Commissioned by CAFOD for the Jubilee Year, this beautiful icon was created by Ethiopian artist Mulugeta Araya. The painting is rich in symbolism, reflecting themes of mercy, hope, and justice. The icon interprets Jesus' teaching of healing and liberation in the synagogue, as described in Luke 4:16–21, which refers to Isaiah 61:1–2. This passage is particularly relevant to the Jubilee, given its emphasis on bringing good news to those who are poor and liberty to those who are captive or oppressed. In this passage, Jesus reads from the scroll of Isaiah:

"The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to proclaim good news to the poor.

He has sent me to proclaim liberty to the captives and recovering of sight to the blind,

to set at liberty those who are oppressed,


to proclaim the year of the Lord's favour."

(Luke 4:18-19)

Following an assembly, led by Mr. Ross, who explained the meaning behind various elements of the icon, each year group had the opportunity to spend time in quiet reflection and prayer with the artwork. This was a truly special experience, allowing our students to engage with the icon in a meaningful and spiritual





### <u>Primary Maths Challenge – Bonus</u> Round Success



In Year 6, we have been busy designing and making moving toys using cam mechanisms. We are very proud of our finished products!














#### **World Book Day Celebration!**



Sport at St. Joseph's is supported by Alex, a coach from Holloway coaching, who also supply a number of our sporting after school clubs.





#### **Summer Uniform Reminders**

When we return after the Easter break, all pupils will be expected to wear their summer uniform.

A few reminders regarding school policies:

- •Hair: For health and safety reasons, all hair that can be tied back should be, regardless of gender. Hair accessories must be plain and simple. Fashion hairstyles (e.g., shaved sides, patterns) and noticeable hair products are not permitted.
- •Jewellery: Jewellery is not allowed, except for one small, plain stud earring per ear for children in Year 1 and above. Earrings must be removed for PE and sports events, so if your child is getting their ears pierced, please do so at the start of the summer holidays. Reception children must not wear earrings. Necklaces, bracelets, and rings are not permitted. Year 2 and above may wear an analogue watch, but Fitbits and SMART watches are not allowed.
- •Name Labels: Please ensure all items of uniform and equipment are clearly labelled with your child's name to avoid loss and mix-ups.
