Cafod Assembly





Year 4 Explore Local Heritage at Upminster Windmill

As part of their local history topic, Year 4 recently enjoyed a fascinating visit to the historic Upminster Windmill. This trip offered a wonderful opportunity for the children to deepen their understanding of the local area's past and brought their classroom learning vividly to life.

During the visit, the children learned about the history of the mill, how it was used over the years, and the vital role it played in the local community. They explored the different parts of the windmill and discovered how each area functioned-from grinding grain to storing flour.

One of the highlights was learning about the Abraham family, who once owned the mill. Their story gave the children a real sense of how life and work in the area have changed over time. The knowledgeable guides also showed us the mill's facilities and explained how the machinery operated some of it still in working order today!

The visit was not only educational but also thoroughly enjoyable. The children asked thoughtful questions, showed great curiosity, and came away with a deeper appreciation for our local heritage.






London's Burning!

Year 2 had a fantastic day launching their new History topic all about *The Great Fire of London*. The children travelled back in time to 1666 and experienced what life was like. They took on roles as seamstresses, bakers, perfumers, and more, fully immersing themselves in the sights, sounds, and smells of 17th-century London. The children discovered how the fire began, the reasons it spread so quickly, and the lasting impact it had on the city. One of the children's favourite facts of the day was discovering that Samuel Pepys buried his cheese to keep it safe from the flames! It was a brilliant start to the topic, with lots of fun and learning along the way.









Science Workshop

Our children took part in an exciting science workshop titled *"Change and Adapt."* The session was packed with hands-on experiments and engaging demonstrations that helped the children explore a range of physics-based concepts.

The workshop began with an investigation into how bubbles behave on different surfaces. The children compared how bubbles reacted when placed on smooth versus rough materials, sparking great curiosity and discussion. They were also fascinated by the illusion of colours, especially when exploring Newton's colour wheel and the science behind rainbows. One of the highlights was learning about water vapour and air pressure using an air bazooka! This fun demonstration helped the children understand how vapour travels through the air. The importance of hygiene was also brought to life as we observed how easily germs can be transferred from one surface to another. To finish, we explored the absorbency of materials by investigating the superabsorbent powder found in nappies. The children were amazed at how much liquid it could hold!

It was a fantastic workshop that brought science to life and encouraged the children to ask questions, think critically, and have lots of fun along the way.



Year 6 Visit to Young Citizens Event

On Monday 23rd June, our Year 6 children attended the Havering Young Citizen afternoon–a fantastic opportunity to meet police officers, fire service workers, and others who play vital roles in our community. The event provided valuable information to support their transition to secondary school, including the importance of wearing cycle helmets and how to stay safe when travelling independently. The children behaved impeccably and thoroughly enjoyed the experience, gaining confidence and knowledge for the next stage of their journey.


Victory for St. Joseph's in The Havering Rotary Quiz!






International Day – 13th June 2025

A Musical Treat from Los Amigos!








<u>Parental Survey Results – Thank You for Your Feedback</u>
