




## <u>Assessment Success!</u>

We would like to take a moment to celebrate the hard work and determination shown by children across the school who took part in statutory assessments this year, including the Year 1 Phonics Screening, Year 4 Multiplication Tables Check, and the End of Key Stage 2 SATs. While these assessments offer just a snapshot of what our children are capable of, we are incredibly proud of the effort, perseverance and positive attitude they demonstrated in preparing for and completing them. Their resilience and commitment truly reflect their growth and learning. You will see from the results below that the number of children at St Joseph's who achieve the expected standards are consistently above that of the national average. Below is a summary of our KS2 SATs outcomes.

Congratulations to the entire team for this remarkable achievement.


We hope to continue our chess club next year so we can continue our reign as Deanery champions! Look out for more information to follow in the new school year.

#### Another Visit from S.T.E.M Parent


